✓ Main obejctives of the NALIS Project:

- Network of academic libraries

- Union library catalogue of the libraries involved any library user to be able check the availability of a publication in member libraries' holdings

- Unification of the level of automation of the academic libraries - NALIS has integrated the incompatible formats and standards of the differing software platforms in all libraries, using MARC 21 and Ex Libris' products (so far Primo, Aleph, DigiTool, MetaLib/SFX)

- Increasing the level of quality

✓ Key achievements of the NALIS Project:

- The NALIS Union Catalogue ca. 2,5 mil records
- The Interlibrary Loan Module accessible directly through the NALIS catalogue; free ILL for NALIS members
- <u>Template for description of medieval manuscripts</u> compatible with MARC 21 and ALEPH
- 5 MARC 21 papers translated and published
- 3 library dictionaries created, published and updated


# NALIS members 30 libraries in Bulgaria + 1 foreign collaborate:


#### Number of records in the NALIS Union Catalogue 2,497,942





✓ **Digital content** ca. 12,000 items:

- NALIS Foundation 10,362 photographs from more than 19 collections;
- CL-BAS 1,092 early prints and a collection of letters;
- SUL 858 early prints, archival materials, reedings, thesises;
- NL (starting Aug 2013) 424 early prints, manuscripts;
- NBU 173 titles for students.



#### **OTHER PROJECTS**

Europeana Photography – EU project for integration of artistically valuable photos of the years 1839–1939 in Europeana:

- 19 collaborators of NALIS
- 10,362 photographs in the NALIS collections
- 2 applications developed, furhter 2 started

 World Digital Library – US Library of Congress project for volunteering memory institutions worldwide
 NALIS is going to integrate 400 digitsed old printed books from the CL-BAS holdings

Enlargement of the library network and catalogue (within and outside Bulgaria)

- Exchange of best practices and know-hows, unification of standards, clouding
- > Moving from technological to social impact
- Further development of the ILL module
- > Investing in the accumulation of digital content
- Investing in controlled vocabularies (at a later stage)

- Software platform of the world leading libraries;
- Quicker and easier access to a reacher information pool;
- An international library catalogue is a challange.

#### ✓ Why on the Balkans?

- Because of the common culture and history;
- There is no such centre in the region;
- To foster Balkan studies, cultural and scientific collaboration.



#### ✓ What would my library benefit?

- Our patrons will simultaneously search the integrated library catalogues, digital collections as well as subscribed databases and periodicals of the libraries involved and have free access to all the bib data and digital content provided;
- Popularisation;
- No financial investments or further staff required;
- Most advanced information servicess and access;
- Opportunities to apply for EU funding.



## THE NALIS CATALOGUE

✓ Stages:

- Integration of the founding libraries bib content completed in 2010:
- 50 libraries of BAS using ALEPH,
- the 27 libraries of SU using ALEPH
- Panitza library of AUBG using VTLS
- 2. Integration of the founding libraries **retroconverted** records ongoing




3. Integration of the associate libraries bib content –
3 other LIS used by them so far:

- Q Series
- ABV (domestic)
- PrimaSoft (domestic)
- 4. Integration of the bib records of NL just started
  - COBISS successfully tested
- 5. Integration of **Balkan libraries** bib content tests started
  - Carol I Central University Library of Bucharest successfully tested (on VUBIS)

PNX records are:

- Normalised
- Dedublicated
- FRBRised (Functional Requirements for Bibliographic Records)
- Ranked according to usage
